The Beatification of Mary MacKillop – A Celebration for all Australians

On 19 January 2025, we celebrated the 30th anniversary of Saint Mary MacKillop's Beatification - a significant milestone that highlights Mary's enduring legacy as Australia's first saint.

Beatified on 19 January 1995, by Pope John Paul II, Mary MacKillop was recognised for her profound faith, compassion, and tireless dedication to education.

As co-founder of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, Mary established schools across Australia for the most marginalised children, and she played an important role in establishing universal education across Australia.

At Mary Mackillop Today we are dedicated to carrying on Mary's legacy, both in Australia and overseas, believing in the power of education to break the cycle of poverty for young people. Young people like nine-year-old Joaquim, from a remote village in Timor-Leste. His teacher attended our 5-day Teacher Training Project workshop, where she gained the skills and knowledge, she needed to ensure that her students receive a quality education in her classroom.

Joaquim has just gone into 3rd grade and he's happy with how motivated his teacher is for him to learn.

"When I go home, I try and learn everything that I need to, for school the next day. I borrow books from my teacher and take them home so that I can study hard. My teacher is teaching us how to be good people and I really like her."

When women and girls are uplifted, their families and whole communities' flourish.

International Women's Day, held annually on the 8th of March, is a global day that recognises the resilience and strength of women across the world. Acknowledging this important day allows Mary MacKillop Today to reflect on the invaluable contributions of women within the communities we support.

Through our work, we seek to promote the voice and participation of women in spaces where they have been typically excluded. We witness firsthand the transformative power of women and girls in their communities when they are empowered.

Like in Fiji, where our Women's Leadership program – Project Talitha – run in partnership with Ola Fou Fiji, is providing training to young women to increase their confidence and achieve financial security to grow as leaders in their communities.

Ranadi is a young single mum who has been challenging traditional norms surrounding women through her participation in Project Talitha.

"When I was pregnant while studying at university, I feared what people would think of me. Last year, I joined Project Talitha, attending every training session. The empowerment training really stood out to me. It helped me face my fears of being judged and feeling alone. Now, I have the confidence to speak up and share my story. I'm helping my mum with our coconut business and dream of returning to university, finding a job, and one day running my own business to support my son," Ranadi shared.

We are proud to continue the pioneering work of Saint Mary MacKillop and the Sisters of St Joseph in transforming the lives of women and girls like Ranadi through learning for life, so that all may thrive.



"Saint Mary MacKillop was a phenomenal person. She is what we should all aspire to be."

Jane tells us "I grew up as the eldest of six children in Shepparton. Growing up in a large household meant that I learnt about the importance of taking care of other people besides myself from a very early age. I'm sure this has influenced my decision to give regular donations to Mary MacKillop Today.

When I was at school, I learnt a lot about social justice leaders – people who stood up for their communities, no matter what the consequences. Saint Mary MacKillop really stood out for me as she looked after people that everyone else had walked away from. Mary just believed that is what we should all do.

Back in 2000, I was involved in a fundraising project with a



colleague, selling coffee to raise funds for an education project run in a village in Timor-Leste. This experience sparked an interest in how I could further support education in the country. I had heard about the educational work that Mary MacKillop Today was doing in Timor-Leste and with the connection to Saint Mary, it felt like the right cause to support.

I continue to be inspired by the history of the Sisters of Saint Joseph who developed educational resources and programs in Timor-Leste back in the '90s. They worked in partnership with local communities who had no support or resources, and I believe that Mary MacKillop Today is continuing this vital work with those who are most in need.

I am happy to keep giving monthly donations as it means I have a really considered way of contributing to Mary MacKillop Today's work. Knowing that my donations allow the organisation to plan its projects properly is a great feeling."

Travels through Peru – a field trip update

Yesenia Romano, our Programs Coordinator for Peru, recently spent 10 days in Peru with our partners and program participants to learn about the impact of the work that you are supporting through your generous donations.

While on her trip, Yesenia had the opportunity to visit participants of the 'Enhancing Women's Civil Participation in Rural Peru' project run in partnership with CCAIJO, in the Quispicanchi Cusco province to learn about their experiences of learning to be leaders in their communities. This project provides training to elected female councillors and leaders, helping them perform their duties more efficiently and boosting their confidence to actively participate in decision-making spaces.

"It is always inspiring to hear from women who are often shy and previously overlooked speak out and share how the training and experiences gained from the project are transforming many aspects of their lives," shared Yesenia.

While speaking with the female participants, Yesenia heard how one woman felt embarrassed about attending the workshops as she could not read or write. The team from



CCAIJO assured her that "those who cannot read or write still know how to think and speak" and that was all she needed to hear to sign up for the rest of the project. Another participant shared that she was inspired to join the project after witnessing how her mother was treated by her community. "I joined the project because I saw that my mother was not allowed to participate in the community assemblies. Was my mother so worthless that they wouldn't let her participate? Everything I learn. I share in the radio program that I'm involved in as part of the project."

We wish all the women involved in this project the best of luck in finding their voice.
